Finally, Vicolocorto is partner of different strategic partnerships with other European countries and writes **publications** on formal education and on youth work quality at a European level.

## My EVS experience in Vicolocorto



Ciao a tutti, mi chiamo Lýdia, sono slovacca e ho trenta anni.

Not too shabby for one week in Italy, right? 😊

It is hard to believe that little over two weeks ago I was still in Slovakia, kind of lost and not knowing what lies in front of me and now I find myself in the midst

of what is quite possibly the biggest adventure of my life yet.

The first time I heard about European Voluntary Service (EVS) was when I was a student at the university, about to obtain my Master degree in European cultural studies.

When I saw, quite by chance, an urgent call for female EVS volunteer at Vicolocorto in Pesaro, Italy, I applied immediately. I knew I had nothing to lose. The next day I had a Skype interview and the day after I was selected. My life was about to change forever and for the better. I knew that much.

A week later I found myself at the Pesaro train station, equally terrified and excited, and almost sure that this was only a dream and not my new reality. I was immediately met with amazing kindness and welcoming I've never received in my whole life, not only by the staff of Vicolocorto, but especially by five fellow volunteers that were impatiently waiting to meet me, at our volunteer house in Santa Veneranda. What followed was an amazing series of events connected not only to volunteering but also free time spent with my new friends, my new family for the next 8 months.

I applied for this EVS project because I think that investing time and energy, support and knowledge into youth has a great meaning, being for them perhaps that someone we wish we had when we were growing up, and ultimately helping them realize their own potential.

I think EVS is the safest and quite possibly the most meaningful way of travelling abroad. It is an amazing opportunity to grow not only professionally but also personally, to better your language skills and it is definitely a huge leap out of your comfort zone.

So far, during the last two weeks we have been in two schools of Pesaro, the Istituto Comprensivo G. Gaudiano and the Istituto di Istruzione Superiore F. Mengaroni. The school year has only begun so we will be giving much more presentations. In the first Istituto, we presented ourselves and we talked about why we decided to do the EVS. We also talked about the differences between our countries and Italy (e.g. at what time we have lunch and dinner, how does the life of a teenager look like, what are the differences between educational systems), about the city of Pesaro and the surroundings, and about the European Voluntary Service. At the second Istituto we prepared some presentations: the first about Portugal, its customs, food, etc. The second presentation was about the novel Don Quixote, written by a Spanish writer. Then it was the turn of The Netherlands, where we talked about Sinterklaas, their Christmas festivity. Finally, the last presentation was about Poland, also about its customs, cities, food and traditions.

It was very gratifying to see how kids paid attention to our stories and learnt from the different cultures that we brought them. They were a little bit shy at the beginning, but soon they started to ask some questions and to talk with us. It is also gratifying to see that, at the same time, they were learning English in a very dynamic and entertaining way, without even being conscious that they were learning. But, furthermore, not only did the children learn from this, we ourselves learned from each other. This is, from my point of view, the best thing about EVS: the opportunity to learn from other's experiences and lives.

# WHERE?

## PESARO



Pesaro is a city and Municipality in the Italian region of Marche, capital of the Province of Pesaro e Urbino, on the Adriatic Sea, with a population of around 95.011 inhabitants, making it the second most populous city in the region, after Ancona.

Pesaro is recognised as "Cycling City" (Città della Bicicletta) in recognition of its **extensive network of bicycle paths** and promotion of cycling. It is also known as "**City of Music**" as it is the birthplace of the composer **Gioacchino Rossini**. The historical centre of Pesaro is rich of points of interest like Palla di Pomodoro, the Conservatorio, the theatre, the museums, the fountain in the main square and casa Rossini.

It is located between **two coastal hills**, the San Bartolo and the Ardzio, so you can **enjoy both the seaside and hiking in the hills**. The San Bartolo, in particular, is a Natural Park so you can also discover its beauty and the small towns near it.

Thanks to Rossini, **Pesaro is famous for Pizza Rossini**: a pizza garnished with tomato sauce , mozzarella, boiled eggs and mayonase. It can sound weird at the beginning, but you have to try!
